<p>The Cotats arguably produce some of the finest Sauvignon Blancs in the Loire Valley. Like many French families who have been tending their small plots of vines for years, their secret is simply working harder than others. Organic farming, low yields, and late harvesting, combine to produce wines of great complexity, nerve, and personality. "Les Monts Damnes" translates roughly as the "Damn Mountains Vineyard," steep slopes that can only be harvested by hand. The steepest plots can only be harvested by sliding down the hill with a cushion tied to your rear...now that is dedication. The results translate into a wine that is full of sweet pear, apple, and Meyer lemon notes with intense minerality and racy acidity that makes for an utterly complex finish...Yum...</p>

* Didier Dagueneau arguably produces the finest Sauvignon Blancs in the world. His craft is the ultimate fusion of modern winemaking, and ultra traditional techniques of vineyard management. He does nothing half way, and thus his wines achieve the ultimate expression of grape varietal, terroir, climate, and technique. To tend his vineyards he employs twice the number of employees used in a conventional winery and produces on average yields that are but a mere fraction of his neighbors. The results are wines that literally explode with dimensions of fruit and complexity that rival the greatest dry white wines in the world. His straight 05 is perhaps the leanest and most mineral of his wines, "Buisson Renard" offers a touch more richness, with "Pur Sang" and "Silex," both being barrel aged, battling it out for the most complexity. "Paradoxe," is a wine that is made from exceptionally ripe grapes and contains a hint of residual sugar and is his most concentrated and exotic wine. "Clos du Calvaire" is a wine that has only been made once before in the 99 vintage and is a Sauvignon Blanc unlike any other Didier makes. Finally, "Astéroïde," is a wine that Didier "makes for himself" and because he prefers not to sell this wine he prices it accordingly. Only 300 bottles were made in 2000. A monument.
